About the turn of the century, the British Peat Moss Litter Company brought over from Holland, several Dutch families to work on the moors, and they built Moss Terrace at Moorends to house them. Subsequently these houses were to be known as Dutch Row. There are still a few of these good people living here today. Names which come to mind are Kempen, Verhees, Smit and Van Hoof.
